REFLECTIONS: 'I thank God, Oh how I thank God...'

This week I reach a milestone, in fact a 'new' anniversary, added to my life just three years ago. On 8 December I celebrate [and I really do celebrate] three years since I had totally unexpected open heart cardiac surgery to by-pass thirteen arterial blockages, with five of these being rated at 90% blocked or worse. I was just days away from doing an alpine ice-climb with a guide which the cardiologist later said would have meant me being brought down in a body bag. I was a walking time-bomb but neither I, nor my family, or my



brothers and sisters in the Christchurch Branch knew anything about it. Something was about to explode in me and either maim or kill me. Looking back I now recognise two warning signs. The first I did not recognise as significant and so I ignored it. The second I acted on and this eventually led to identification and urgent surgery.

Relative to my age I was, and still am, fit. A non-smoker or drinker, consistently weighing in at 78-80kgs, body fat index ranging 16.5 to 19.5, walking an average of six or seven kilometres every morning, pushing weights, and alpine tramping and climbing. But inside me lurked family genes prone to heart related issues. And that was the problem. And so as I worked hard to get my body fit for that high ice-climb my training concentrated on stamina build up. I trained several times a week on stamina build up on an unrelentingly steep track on the hills above Christchurch. I targeted faster and faster times. Until one day I quit half way up, and quitting was new to me. I was struggling but I justified quitting by the lateness of my start that day, by the coldness and rain that day. It was the first warning that my heart was struggling, but I missed the signal. However the second warning, on which I acted, was clearer and was witnessed by Veronica. We were flying home from working in Malaysia and the Boeing 777 was about three hours out of Christchurch. The date was 4 September. Then the pilot announced there had just been a 'significant earthquake in Christchurch' and the airport was closed and the city damaged. We would be diverted to Auckland. This was the big magnitude 7.1 at 4.35am

that ruptured the previously unknown Greendale Fault and became the beginning of our ongoing earthquake challenges. Within minutes of the announcement I suddenly felt a dull ache across my chest, not severe, just an ache, but Veronica spotted me rubbing it and she could see I was a bit concerned. We talked about it and I promised to see my doctor. Things were hectic when we eventually got home and so a month later I mentioned the incident to my doctor in the course of a regular visit. And thus began the journey of investigation and the expenditure of about \$43,000 by my health insurer.

I never assumed that I would come through such complex surgery, with so many constricted arteries, successfully. I had done my best to prepare that I might not pull through and I was at reasonable peace when wheeled away from Veronica into surgery. And I had talked with Robert Van Doorn and my daughter Sue and updated them on some personal affair matters. But the Lord allowed that I should come through.

Yes, this journey has changed me, but how?

- I have learnt, as most all of us will at some point, that health is not a right or a given, rather it is a blessing. And for this blessing I am now more conscious and thankful to the Lord. Now I frequently look ahead to the coming change of seasons and pray the Lord will grant me say another autumn [my favourite season] with those glorious leaf-falls, or that I might enjoy another summer holiday with Veronica, another Summer Oasis and our hosting young people, to be there for my grandchildren getting married, to return here to Parapara where I am writing this, etc. I no longer take these as given. I seek them of the Lord.
- And I wonder at the mystery of how things work out. The earthquakes have and do cause me and many others in Lamb of God much anxiety and stress. But if the Greendale had not ruptured on that 4 September I might not be alive today.

And since having this health challenge I have thought a lot more about our vulnerability, and our reliance on God, and our journey with and in the Lord to the Eternal Kingdom of our Eternal God. My journey is with Veronica, with my family, and with you in the family of the Lamb of God. My perspectives have changed.

See you up in those glorious mountains, God willing.

SUPERSTORM DEVASTATES AREAS OF THE PHILIPPINES

Some years ago I had the privilege to be counted as an 'Honorary Filipino' as I participated in a Sword of the Spirit International Assembly sitting each day with a team of senior leaders of communities from the Philippines. These fine brothers readily 'adopted the Kiwi' and lasting friendships were formed. Spanky Meer was one of those men, and this week I received a letter from him in his capacity as Senior Head Coordinator of the Ang Ligaya ng Panginoon Community [Joy of the Lord] in Manila. Spanky is inviting members and friends of the Lamb of God to stand with other Sword of the Spirit Communities and financially respond to the devastating super-typhoon which has caused massive destruction and loss of life throughout his country.

The National Council of Lamb of God has made an immediate initial response from community funds and arranged an urgent financial transmission of \$2,000. We now invite you to read the letter from Spanky, see below, and if you have not already responded to this disaster through other agency appeals, you can do so through the Ligaya ng Panginoon Foundation by following the instructions as below.

Peace in the Lord, Roger

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Sword of the Spirit,

Greetings of peace and an appeal from your brothers and sisters from Ang Ligaya ng Panginoon Community [Joy of the Lord], on behalf of our suffering brethren.

The devastating typhoon Haiyan which left thousands of helpless victims in Central Philippines or the Visayas region, has moved many hearts to find ways to alleviate their pain and suffering. We are sure that by now, you must have seen on TV and read in the newspapers about the unprecedented damage to life and property caused by the strongest typhoon that has hit this planet in the last 100 years. This typhoon left thousands dead and survivors begging for help in rain-soaked wasteland. Nearly 10 million people or 10% of the country's population have been affected, while 660,000 have lost their homes per report of the United Nations.

In solidarity with the entire nation and the rest of the world, the Ligaya ng Panginoon Foundation Inc. based in Manila which was not affected by the typhoon has organized a fund-raising campaign and relief goods operation in Metro Manila and Cebu for the most affected areas in the Visayas region such as Tacloban City, Ormoc and other towns in Leyte and Samar provinces.

MATTERS FROM THE NOVEMBER NATIONAL COORDINATOR COUNCIL

The 60th meeting of the National Council was held in Auckland on November 2. Usually these meetings have an extensive and wide ranging agenda but this time it was limited to just three items, being: Earthquake Damage to the Lamb of God Centre, Considering the September Report of the Sword of the Spirit Visitation Team, and where are we at with Succession Planning towards the 2014 Senior Coordinator vote.

Due to our nature as a multi-locational community, all gatherings of the National Council commence with breakfast together, followed by a time of worship, waiting on any prophetic word, a brief Biblical Reflection, and then a couple of hours in personal sharing. With this relational base established we then settled into matters of the agenda. Following is a brief report on the three agenda deliberations:

A. Lamb of God Centre: Damage and Rebuild

We discussed an updated appraisal of the situation. This included options we have now that we have an indication of the final insurance settlement. This settlement is significantly below our insured value at the time of the earthquakes. Following discussion we agreed a three point proposal which had been submitted by the Trustees of the Lamb of God Charitable Trust together with the Christchurch Branch Body of Elders. This includes investing, if necessary, additional funds from National Community invested reserves. We are pursuing either a new building on-site but to a smaller

footprint, or a repair/upgrade and modernisation of the current main building which is closed from use due to damage and it being just 8% compliant under the revised EQ Code.

B. Sword of the Spirit 2013 Visitation Report from the Visitation Team [VT]

The VT Report had been circulated in advance of the meeting. We took several hours to discuss and evaluate the report, the majority of which concentrated, as anticipated, on our Auckland Branch. Auckland has scheduled an all-day planning meeting for later in November which will include consideration of VT report.

C. Succession Matters

We started this session with a review and assessment of 'where we are at' following over eighteen months of various discussions, including two meetings and reports from a task team named 'Triangle+1' which was comprised of agreed potential candidates. It was apparent from the various personal circumstances of the agreed potential candidates, plus the significant and ongoing impact on the National Community of the Christchurch earthquakes, that in the words of one council member 'we are just not ready.' This conclusion, agreed by all, took us to discuss a proposal circulated for consideration several months ago by another council member, and termed as 'Option G' which proposed an extension of Roger's term of service by two years. However before any discussion or vote, Roger raised an associated matter being some National Council 'focussed streamlining' if he was to continue in this service. He proposed formation of a Service Team within the National Council based on the model of the Christchurch Service Team, and set up to advance our work more quickly, to be assigned tasks by the National Council, and to report to that Council. The Service Team would be tasked to study and recommend on:

- Full review of the Constitution
- o Introduction of Terms of Service for Main Branch Leaders
- o Consideration to adding more younger leaders [NC and NWLC]
- o Reviewing the role and service of the National Women's Council
- Assignment of Service Responsibilities [Portfolios] to NC Members
- o Study of Honorarium payments for substantial NC Responsibilities
- o Engaging Spiritual Warfare and Intercession [nationwide ministry]
- o Addressing 'no growth' what can we do?

Tom Caballes led the Council through discussion on the above matters and then into a vote, which was unanimous, in agreed an extension of Roger's term by two years.

Aaron Fisk, Rachel McKenzie and Natalie Tan rendered music to warm the souls, our own Line Dancing Maestro, John Tham invigorated the evening with a session in Line Dancing and of course our service team spared no effort in making it a memorable Nite for our much loved seniors. This was a good night to remember for all of us, and the added blessing was to have some of the National Council members present that evening.

CHALLENGES IN LIVING TOGETHER AS COMMUNITY

Resource for House Group Discussion by Tom Caballes Metamorphosis - December 2013

You have been raised to life with Christ, so set your hearts on the things that are in heaven, where Christ sits on his throne at the right side of God. Keep your minds fixed on things there, not on things here on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. Your real life is Christ and when he appears, then you too will appear with him and share his glory!

[Colossians 3:1-4]

When I was young I loved watching butterflies flutter about in the garden. They looked very colourful, vivid and lively. I could not imagine how it came from an ugly, slow, bland-coloured caterpillar. It underwent *metamorphosis* in a cocoon. During that time that it was in the cocoon, the hidden transformation takes place from one being to another. In a way, all of us who follow Christ are like in a cocoon now as well. We are being transformed by the Holy Spirit from sinful, weak men and women to becoming eternal sons and daughters of God. Inside us are the very materials needed to be transformed like Jesus, yet we are encapsulated in a frail, rebellious, mortal and sick bodies. Our goal and mission is every day, little by little, to become more and more like a 'butterfly' – Jesus - rather than a 'caterpillar,' which is our old selves.

So How Do We Undergo Metamorphosis in Our Walk with God?

- 1. We need to be detached from material things of this world. Why? For the present form of this world is passing away. 1 Corinthians 7:31. We are meant for a much better place than what the world can offer eternal life in heaven with God.
- 2. If everything is passing away, we need to surrender all our ambitions and plans to God; let them be transformed to be Godly ambitions and plans, not worldly ones.
- 3. We need to keep on shrugging off the old man in us. We need to daily get rid of old patterns and habits of behaving, thinking and relating; if there is any root of bitterness in us, we need to surrender them to God. Let the new man be the victor in us.
- 4. We need to become part of a new people who are also undergoing *metamorphosis*. Our environment is critical and we need to have mutual care and support with people who have the same values, ideals and priorities as with us.
- 5. Share your hidden life to others in this way, it does need to be hidden! Share your most valued possession to others your life in Christ with God!
- 6. Look forward to the completion of *metamorphosis*: we will one day become a son or a daughter of God; our mortal bodies will become immortal. We will see God in Heaven our real treasure. Yearn for it. Long for it. Desire it. Make it real even today.
