REFLECTIONS... 'There is a Reason and a Purpose in our Calling...'



On Saturday 9 May we celebrated the 36th Anniversary of the founding of the Lamb of God in Christchurch. We gathered for a very well attended 'Celebration Evening with the Lord's Day'. During the evening we projected a running photographic presentation of seasons of our life, sang some 'vintage' praise songs, and enjoyed and celebrated with lots of food.

Just two days later we again celebrated, this time for the 30th Anniversary of the founding of the Lamb of God as a National Community. That day back in 1985 began the

foundation of a particular and special work of the Lord - a community declaring that we are 'one people, with one cheque book [one common fund], being ecumenical in nature, and multi-locational in where we live and witness.' Indeed it is a calling in God that is somewhat unique. We are called to live as a people who respect and pursue Christian unity on a daily 'grass-roots' basis under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. We are called to live this life in committed relationships not just where we live, but wherever the Lamb of God is established throughout New Zealand. And we are called from a variety of denominations and streams of the Christian faith, and from many different cultural backgrounds. Wow - only God can do that.

In looking at how we are today, thirty-six years later, it is clear that our Christian Community is markedly different to most of mainstream society. We pray, we raise our children to know the Lord, and our youth to serve the Lord. We meet frequently as families and singles to celebrate and praise God. We care for and support each other emotionally, financially, physically and spiritually. We regularly share our lives together in small groups of men and women. And we do all of this additional to our faithful commitment to our local churches of various denominations. We are pretty 'weird' compared to mainstream New Zealand. But there is more to come. As this nation

becomes more secular, as this nation continues its path of being a world 'leader' in rejecting Christian beliefs and values, we will become more obviously 'different', and therein lies the purpose in God of our call. We need to continue to stand for Christ, for Christian values, for family life, for the inherent value of each person created in the image and likeness of God. We may soon enter a time when even Christian leaders and pastors will be tempted to compromise their beliefs and values to 'mainstream acceptance' rather than to stand against the stream. Community is a call of God for such a time as this.

The founding leaders of the Lamb of God Christchurch Branch will well remember the word declared at the first prayer meeting on 8 July 1979. The word included this declaration 'I call you from the mire and the filth of this world to be my people, you will face many challenges, but know I will be with you step by step by step.'

My time of service in leading our community is drawing to a close. What I am alerting to those who will serve you into the future is this. Yes, it would be great to have a general gathering each week of five hundred men, women and children. Yes it would be great to have a roster of a dozen music teams. Yes it would be easier to have everyone going to the same church, all of the same denomination, all of the same culture. But that is not our call. The Lamb of God is called in this land of Aotearoa to be multi-locational, ecumenical, multi-cultural and a people endeavouring to live a common life, a Christian life, in medium and large sized groups, but also in locations where just a handful of people live out this life in God committed to each other as members of the Lamb of God.

Be careful to discern well, and in prayer, should you ever be tempted to walk an easier path.

He inclined his ear and strained to understand, when a light began to shine within, and he saw the cobwebs of his life.

The man rose and went about his work, while he pondered this experience. As he stepped out he met an old friend, who seemed suddenly a different person, at peace with himself and radiating a spirit of joy. "How did this happen?" he asked.

"Attend a Life in the Spirit seminar," the friend replied," and you will see."

The Auckland branch of the Lamb of God began the proposed LISS at St. Anthony's Church, Mangere, at the end of April and though obstructions due to ongoing road works made it difficult to access the venue easily, many made the decision to attend and have done so.

The teachings and testimonies that follow a time of praise and worship have opened the eyes of participants' understanding to God's love and forgiveness, of the battle that goes on in life, the way of freedom through Jesus Christ, and a new life of peace, joy and power, through the Holy Spirit. Openness in sharing each one's journey in life at the small group sharing enable participants to strengthen their desire to take the steps to

make positive changes. New hope is born, and faith strengthened as each learns, and new friendships are made, and or reinforced.

CHALLENGES IN LIVING TOGETHER AS COMMUNITY

Resource for House Group Discussion by Tom Caballes An Inheritance Awaits - June 2015

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you... [1 Peter 1:3-4]

At times I ponder: what if I was a son of a very rich father, say Bill Gates, whose riches will seemingly never run out? What kind of life would I have lived? Obviously I would never worry about money. I would find a worthy cause to devote my life to. I would want to enjoy my riches too, but not waste it. I would like to help the needy. How about you — what would you do if you were that rich? But then, guess what? We do have a heavenly Father that has unfading, infinite and imperishable riches! The Bible has full of promises of unfathomable treasures for those who follow God and remain faithful to the end. Are you aware of your eternal inheritance? Aren't you excited about it? Do you anticipate it?

So What Do You Do as You Await Your Inheritance of Incomparable Value?

- 1. Being a Christian is the best investment in life, because even if the costs sometimes are high, the dividends are out of this world. Is your life centred in Christ? Have you decided to leave all else behind and follow Him? Have you decided to follow Him to the end, come hell or high waters? If not, now is the time to do so. Think about it: what can compare with eternal life with God? Absolutely nothing.
- 2. Start 'putting on Jesus Christ' now [See Romans 13:14]. God wants you to grow in the character of Christ now and be like Him in all things. God wants others to see Jesus in you.
- 3. Do good by loving God and loving others in whatever situation you are in. And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith. [Galatians 6:9-10]
- 4. Sometimes it is easier said than done, but you need to withstand challenges, trials and difficulties in this life because only those who complete the race wins the prize. So do not give up! Focus on the prize!
- 5. Use your talent, time, money, and resources wisely, especially in building God's Kingdom. Of course you want to enjoy life too as God's sons and daughters; yet be mindful that you will also account for everything you will have done in this life one day. Have a balance in your life in this area.
- 6. What is the best thing you can ever give to your friends and relatives? It is not money or riches. It is Jesus Christ Himself. If you give Jesus to others, they will also have the same infinite inheritance that you will have. A relationship with Jesus is one gift you can freely give to others without lessening any of your own. Actually, the more you share Jesus to others, the more your eternal wealth will be!
- 6. Start looking forward to your inheritance! Have you imagined life without pain, sorrow, sin and death? Have you imagined walking with God and seeing His face? Yearn for that day and time when this will happen because in due time, it will, as long as we are faithful to the end.

OTHER SCRIPTURE PASSAGES:

- 1. And Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." [Mark 10:21]
- 2. But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him." [1 Corinthians 2:9]
- 3. Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. [Colossians 3:23-24]
- 4. Other references: Matthew 13:44-46; Ephesians 1:13-19; Galatians 4:6-7 and 1 Timothy 6:17-19.

Reinforce the guard, station the watchmen, prepare an ambush! The Lord will carry out his purpose... **Jeremiah 51: 12**

HELMET OF SALVATION

Therefore put on the full armour of God ... and take the helmet of salvation... [Ephesians 6: 13, 17].

As Paul is writing this with a soldier guarding him he sees the helmet the soldier is wearing, armour to protect the head but also the same helmet provides a striking symbol of military victory. The helmet is used in many ways today, by cyclists, skateboarders, sportspeople in certain sports, workers [hardhats] in some industries where heads need protection from damage that may occur. The head as we know is an important part of our bodies and if injured can have serious consequences for our lives. Paul sees salvation as our helmet. Jesus came to bring each one of us salvation – salvation from eternal death, separation from God and from all that is evil. The salvation which is in Christ gives us forgiveness for the sins of the past and strength to conquer sin in the days to come. Salvation only come through Jesus as he said in John 14: 6 "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me". As we put on the helmet of salvation we need to see it as more than freedom from the past and protection into the future but as the opportunity to share in the victory Jesus Christ

gained for us by his death on the cross. We need to strive for God's kingdom as a fully armed soldier of Christ as we march steadily through battle after battle being led by our commander in chief, Jesus to victory and finally to eternal life and salvation. Our hope needs to be in Jesus and the salvation he gained for us and his offer to live with him and God our Father forever.
