### REFLECTIONS... 'an environment for boys to become friends, brothers and believers...'



Last weekend we had two vehicles cross the Torlesse Range at Porters Pass and head for Arthurs Pass. We carried seven young boys [Adam, Connor, Oliver, Jamie, Sebastian, Jack and Jonathan], a team of four [Veronica, Kirsten, Robert and Roger], a great deal of food and plenty of wet weather clothing and other gear. This was our second 'Boys Camp in the Mountains.' Last year the boys just loved being up among the peaks and we recall it was very cold with all of the streams and tarns frozen solid- but this year we had snow and ice, in places over half a metre deep. Boy's heaven on earth!

Additional to a continuous stream of snowball fights we managed to fit in building snow castles, several walks into the village, visiting the museum and watching a movie of the early pioneer days of road and tunnel building and crossing the alps on horseback and horse drawn carriage. They were hardy people indeed those rugged pioneers.

In the evenings we had prayer and sharing, a close look into Roger's mountaineering pack to see 'what was used for what purpose', endless games of scrabble, a DVD movie, and a visit to the Arthurs Pass Café for hot chocolate and Kea watching. These mountain birds are large parrots which generally live at over 1,000 metres. They just love parked cars and if left unattended they will easily strip the rubber surrounds from wind shields and dismantle wind-screen wipers.

On the last day we had a tense two and a half hour drive back to the Community Gathering over the passes as a predicted patch of nasty weather hit with storm force.

We made it slowly but safely back over the mountain passes as the snow started to fall. We awoke Monday morning to our quake ravaged city absolutely at a standstill and covered in deep snow. Christchurch recorded its lowest temperature in ninety years with a -6 Celsius.



We see a good deal of evidence that this investment, and these endeavours, with our younger boys are laying foundations into the future. Not only do the participants become firmer friends, but the inter-generational nature of tasking and praying together has value, as does being together in the wondrous majesty of God's creation of high peaks, snow-fields and glaciers and swift rivers. These things open the hearts and awareness of city dwellers to 'there is more to God than the corner church I go to with my parents.'

## NEWS AND ARTICLES

### **Christchurch Branch Reaches Out into the 'Red Zone'**

The government has declared an initial 5,100 homes are to be demolished, mainly in the Easter Suburbs where our Burwood Cluster is situated. The cluster is bordered on three sides by these homes which are declared the 'Red Zone'. It is anticipated a further 7,000 or so homes will be declared 'Red' at a later date. I am delighted to see the Lord God is speaking to and calling our people to serve and reach into the 'Red Zone'.

Kirsten Challies, a member of the leadership team, felt the Lord speaking to her at the Gathering about dropping specially printed 'Cards of Hope' into Red Zone mail boxes with Scripture verses such as "Cast all your anxieties on Him because He cares for you", or "God is our refuge and strength an ever present help in trouble" or "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, present your requests to God. And the peace of God which transcends all understanding will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" or "The Lord is near to all who call on Him". This quickly resulted in leadership approval and the special printing of four separate cards with one each of these Scriptures and adding contact names and telephone numbers with a greeting from the Lamb of God Christian Community. These are now being mail box dropped to homes to be later demolished.

And at our home we had an early morning phone call lasting over thirty minutes from a well-known local business person. He is not a church attending man. He was agitated and stressed as his house is Red Zoned and the government pay- out will leave him with a significant financial short-fall to relocate. He never gave a reason for calling- he just wanted to talk and he knows we are committed Christians. These are not 'ordinary times', they are times charged with God's involvement and His detailed care. Roger

Roger and Veronica attended a prayer meeting at the local Pentecostal Church, the Burwood Christian Centre, and joined their people in a 90 minute time of intercession for the local area. The focus was to seek the Lord to 'heal the land' and to grant 'divine encounters' as church members reached out to serve people, especially in the Red Zone regions. It was a very encouraging time to be with our neighbours in the Lord.

### **More Earthquake Damage at Lamb of God Centre**

Just over a week ago the city was again rocked by an early morning 5.1 magnitude aftershock. Unfortunately this caused further damage to the Lamb of God Centre but in areas which had recently been fixed by our insurers. The aftershock again jammed tight the large sliding panel doors which separate the main auditorium from the lounge, and again caused water leaks in the entrance foyer and auditorium.

### **Bruce Yocum's Talk - Auckland Combined Gathering**

After Winter Oasis - July 24, 2011

Addressed to the Parents in the Lamb of God Community

I just want to say a couple of things, to the parents mainly. This is from Psalm 127: *"Behold, children are heritage from the Lord; the fruit of the womb is a reward."* Throughout the Scripture, and particularly in a few places in the Psalms, the Lord speaks to us about children as a great blessing that come to us from God.

Yet children are a bit of a dangerous blessing, and I'm sure all of you parents experience this in various ways. They are your children, but at the same time they are not yours. They are not yours because they have their own minds, they have got their own will; they are free to do what they want to do. Even if they have all of your DNA, it is

mixed up together and produces something new. They are also not quite yours because they belong to God. They have a direct relationship with God. There is an old saying and you have probably heard it a thousand times, that God has no grandchildren - it is true. Every single one of your children is a child of God, not because they are your children but because through baptism they are born anew of God. God calls them to something. God gives them gifts and God gives them a mission. It might be a little bit surprising and even startling at times when we see it before our eyes: this is my child and my child has a life of his own from God. There is a tremendous richness in our life because of that.

Someone said he saw a baton being passed on during the weekend, from the young adults to the younger ones. I saw another baton being passed on during the course of this weekend. There is a whole generation of younger people, who have grown up here in the midst of the Lamb of God, and God is speaking to them, God is forming them, and God is giving them a mission. We need to encourage and support them, and pray for that mission that God is giving to them, and let them take leadership in it. That is very important – to let them take leadership in it.

David McGill was the founder of the community in Glasgow, Scotland and he was the president of the Sword of the Spirit for a while. Many years ago he started a prayer meeting in Glasgow – a very vibrant and very powerful and charismatic prayer meeting. That founding generation was made of very courageous people – they went out on the streets of Glasgow, preaching to everyone who passed by, proclaiming the gospel openly. Well then his 16 year old daughter went off one summer to Ann Arbor Michigan, and when she came back, 16 years old, she went to her father and said “we need to do something different. We need to build a community.” David was a little bit shocked. He was the father and the founder of this group, and his 16 year old daughter came back with a different vision, with a new vision – “we need to be a community.” David respected what she said. David heard God in it. David saw the Lord leading that group of people through his 16 year old daughter, and for that reason, there is a community in Glasgow today.

Yes they are your children, but then, you are children too. You do not think of Tom Caballes as a child, but he is a child of Jose and Telesfora. He is their child. Yes, they are your children, but they are men and women of God in their own right – they are men and women of God growing up into – they have not grown up all the way - but they are growing up into the stature that God wants them to have in the Holy Spirit. And they will form and shape what the Lamb of God becomes – they will form and shape it, through the gifts that God gives them, the vision that God gives them, the work that God does in them.

So that is really all I want to say. It is very evident, if you are there on a weekend like this with them, how vibrantly the Holy Spirit is at work among them. We need to thank God for that and we need to respect what God does among them. We need to let God do his work in them. We need to let God use them. We need to let them begin to lead as God leads us forward together in our mission. Children are a great, great, great blessing from God. I know a number of communities where the leaders of the communities today are the children of the earlier leaders. And the earlier leaders are now ... receiving from the leadership of their own children. It is a glorious vision, a great thing to see what God is doing in here.

Throughout the Sword of the Spirit, the international Community of Communities to which we belong, individual members of the communities are encouraged to contribute to an Annual Appeal to assist with the high costs of Mission and Community Building work. This was addressed in the recent DVD presentation by our President, Jean Barbara, which was distributed to all leaders for presentation in branches.

The Lamb of God has decided to maintain the Winter Appeal as our vehicle to encourage members and friends to be generous in supporting our ability to continue and expand mission work in the Pacific and here in New Zealand. We enjoy a land of plenty, despite what some are calling 'times of recession'. We do have adequate infra-structure, access to clean water, little pollution, and homes full of many modern conveniences. Yet many people worldwide with whom the Sword of the Spirit work struggle for the very basics. But they love the Lord and they are his people as much as are we.

As well as throughout New Zealand, the Lamb of God works particularly in the Fiji Islands and in parts of Asia and our work is **growing**. You can talk with any of our young people who have participated in our Mission Teams. Mission work does impact and change lives- both ways. We now work with many groups in Fiji and we have established a new community in Nadi. The Fijian economy is under stress and even breakfast cereals we are familiar with can cost as much as F\$14-16 a box in a Nadi Supermarket. Most of the people with whom we work in Fiji would earn less than F\$4.00 an hour. The environment is challenging

## CHALLENGES IN LIVING TOGETHER AS COMMUNITY

Resource for House Group Discussion by Tom Caballes

### Handling Failures in Life

August 2011

*All I want is to know Christ and to experience the power of his resurrection, to share in his sufferings and become like him in his death, in the hope that I myself will be raised from death to life. [Philippians 3:10-11]*

Sometimes we feel that once we follow the Lord, everything will be and should be easy and convenient for us. After all, follow the Lord is difficult enough for us, isn't it? But the reality is different – we all continue to experience pain, suffering, difficulties and failures in life, even when our hearts are with God and it is not our fault. If we look at Paul's life, we may consider him as a failure – as a Pharisee, with all his shipwrecks, imprisonments, beatings, stoning and floggings. But Paul's life was focussed on pleasing God rather than becoming successful in men's eyes.

#### So How Do We Handle Failures in Life?

1. If our failure is due to our own sinfulness, laziness, neglect or other fault of our own doing, we need to admit it. We need to ask the Lord for pardon if we are at fault, and He will forgive us. To those who sincerely repent, our God is not a condemning God – see **Romans 8:1**.
2. All that happens in life is in God's control – even the times when we fail. God can make something good even in the most difficult moments in our lives. *And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. [Romans 8:28]*
3. Realise that God has given all of us skills, talents and abilities; but we also need to have a realistic and humble assessment of them. Refer to **Romans 12:3**. Our failures teach us to be humble and make us admit our limitations and shortcomings.
4. We must avoid the temptation to compare our giftings with others – as there will be someone else with better giftings than ours. We also need to avoid seeking blame or fault for failures; rather, we need to learn from them – if we are not to repeat them.
5. In everything, we need to aim for excellence, not just to “pass the grade.” We need to surrender our hearts to the Lord as we endeavour to use our skills and talents – and then surrender to Him the results of our undertakings.
6. Failure is an opportunity for growth. Failure is like compost – it doesn't look good, it doesn't smell good but it makes for good fertilizer - it makes us grow. Failure is not defeat; it's a great teacher - we learn more from our failures than from our successes.
7. At the end of the day, our lives will not be judged on the basis of our successes and failures. God will judge us based on our obedience and faithfulness to Him. *His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'* **[Matthew 25:21]** We need to focus our lives on being faithful and obedient servants of God, not to be successful, especially in the eyes of the world.

- **1 Corinthians 10:31** ... *whatever you do, do it for the glory of God.*

#### For Personal Reflection and Group Sharing:

1. How have I handled failures in the past? Did I grow and learn from them or did I just forget about them?
2. In my life, how has God turned a failure in the past to be a blessing in the future?
3. Where is my life focussed on: being faithful and obedient, or being successful?

## **PRAYERWATCH: SOLDIERS OF CHRIST, ARISE**

### ***Fight the good fight***

#### **1. Against the lusts of the flesh** [1 Peter 2: 11]
