### REFLECTIONS... A Torrid, Testing, and Stressful, yet 'God at Work' Time

On 22 December Veronica and I decided we could start to put up family photographs and pictures and get ornaments and other items out of storage and back on our walls and onto our cabinets. We were getting ready to celebrate Christmas! And then 'wham', in a period of fifteen hours on 23 December we were hit by a swarm of powerful earthquakes including four big ones of magnitudes 6.2, 5.3, 6.0 and 5.1. In the next fifteen hours we had over forty shakes. Our home, God bless it, shook and rolled but stood firm. Amazingly the whole city came through pretty well. We lost power in the east for a couple of hours but sewer, water and other essential services came through well. By late afternoon we decided to go ahead with our pre-shake intention of pruning and tidying the garden and so we gardened until dusk and then called over to visit Mark and Kirsten and family for a time of fellowship- and a nice stiff rum and coke!



Nine days later on 2 January we had another swarm with forty-eight earthquakes in twenty-four hours and with much regret we then called off the Summer Oasis Youth Conferences which were to commence 8 January. It would have probably been a bit frightening for visitors coming in from other centres into Christchurch if experiencing an earthquake would be a new sensation. We were 'gutted' in making this decision. And of course during the whole of the time Summer Oasis was to have run we hardly had a ripple. Sigh.

Since mid-January we are starting to witness the beginning of the demolition of thousands of homes in the Red Zones, which are mainly in the Eastern Suburbs where the Lamb of God Burwood Cluster is located. The region close to our home and along the Avon River looks now like a disaster zone, and has for a while now. Red stickered abandoned homes are everywhere along the river and in adjacent suburbs and this has brought the danger of fire as unkempt grass and gardens grow a metre and higher with no-one to care for them. And now the demolition teams are starting to move in. This next stage is reported to last up to two years and it will be interesting indeed to see just how our neighbourhoods will look. For example it is hard to imagine how Burwood will look when there will be only about four homes left between our home and close to the Palms



Shopping Complex along New Brighton Road. And as we look across the Avon, [photo on right] which is just sixty metres away, there will be nothing standing on the far bank in what was the suburb of Avondale. And if we turn towards the coast along the river, once we pass the east end of the cluster zone, there will be nothing for a couple of kilometres along the river bank right down to the estuary. For future generations this could well become a wonderful semi-wilderness area with significant bird and wildlife.

Times have been challenging, and interesting, because where else on earth has there been a similar set of circumstances? There certainly have been much more devastating earthquakes in other places, but where else have we seen earthquakes concentrated in such numbers, soon to pass 10,000, in one small city of 350,000 and its surrounding region?

***However in the midst of all of this challenge and change, there is God. And where God is, there is hope and mission and many blessings.***

We are literally 'thrown together', and with our many children, and under our differing circumstances, with nowhere to go. We are together as a declared Christian people. We did commit our lives together and together, and by God's Grace, we will stay together. Is it possible for us to maintain 'community as it once was' with weekly teachings, house groups, pastoral care, many outreaches, lots of socials, member meetings and branch Lord's Days? No. And getting back to such a schedule could take a long time yet. Right now we have little ability to focus for long periods, or sit through a talk with lots of main points. But we do have things we want to share about such as the damage to our homes, the frustration of no information from the Earthquake Recovery Authority, and more. When we arrive at our meetings we are a mixture of feeling good, feeling tired, needing prayer, or ready to give prayer. I think that is great - we are normal, and as normal people should - we need God.

And in all of this it is a joy for me to see the resilience of this Christian people, to be inspired by my brothers and sisters. I know the sharing that goes on. I know the prayer and the hope. And I know without a doubt that the generations of children we are raising

in this branch, through these challenges, are going to be mighty witnesses for a Mighty God.

The future is looking good. God is with us and what better place for a Christian Community to be than at the heart of a people in need, people who are hurting, and people who are lonely, isolated and confused. For there, if you are a believer, is Christ. And if you are like me [and you are] you have invited this same Christ to be your personal Lord.

In the weeks to come we will of course continue to support and love one another as a Christian people, but we will also be starting the journey together of engaging the work the Lord would have us do in reaching into the unbelievable amount of service and mission now surrounding us in this city.

I also address those reading this Reflection who live in our various branches, or in Sword of the Spirit Communities worldwide - do not be surprised if the Lord starts to speak to you about coming to join us for a while. There is much to do these coming years and somehow God has placed us right at the centre. If you feel the Lord speaking to you about coming then please talk about it with your pastoral leaders and start to discern.

I wouldn't be anywhere else but here right now with our people.

## CHALLENGES IN LIVING TOGETHER AS COMMUNITY

Resource for House Group Discussion by Tom Caballes

### "I Never Promise You A Rose Garden..."

February 2012

*For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed to us. [Romans 8:18]*

Clearly, one of the easiest lessons that I learned after becoming a renewed Christian is that not everything will be easy. I thought that after all, following Jesus is hard enough; surely the rest of my life will fall into place. But no – relationships suffer from misunderstandings, goals and plans are not met, health can be an ongoing issue, and the world and our flesh linger on that makes following God much harder. Although God never promised us a rose garden, one thing He promised: He will be with us through trials, hardships and sufferings, and He will never abandon us.

#### So How Do We Persevere Through Sufferings in Our Lives?

1. We need to put suffering into perspective: that it is not meant to be permanent. We live in seasons of joy and sorrow, blessings and suffering, and in abundance and in want. We need to endure suffering; yes, the wheel will turn in due time.
2. Suffering makes us less self-sufficient and more God-dependent. It can draw us closer to God, with the right attitude and frame of mind. Suffering can draw us away from God, but it can also draw us near to God. We can question God why this or that happens, but we can also put our hope and trust in Him, knowing good can come out from any situation [see **Romans 8:28.**] Which one will we choose?
3. Suffering can be a tool for growing into His image and character. It can make us more patient, loving, kind and understanding – if we choose to do so. It can also make us bitter, resentful and angry – if we choose to do so. Suffering can bring out the worst in us, but also the best in us. It tests us, purifies us and moulds us.
4. We need to embrace suffering as a normal part of our lives. *Consider it pure joy, my brothers, when you are involved in various trials, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance. But you must let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking nothing. [James 1:2-4].*
5. Suffering makes us long for heaven, where there will be no more "grief, crying, or pain..." [**Revelations 21:4**]. It makes us realise that we are not meant for this world, that we are meant for something much, much better: to spend eternity with God.

#### Other Scripture References

1. **Isaiah 55:8-9:** *"My thoughts are not your thoughts, and my ways are not your ways," declares the LORD. "Just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways, and my thoughts are higher than your thoughts."*
2. **2 Corinthians 4:17:** *Our suffering is light and temporary and is producing for us an eternal glory that is greater than anything we can imagine.*
3. Others: **Isaiah 43:1-7; Isaiah 49:14-16; 1 Peter 1:3-8; and James 1:12.**

#### For Personal Reflection and Group Sharing:

1. What season in my life am I in at the moment: at the highest, at the lowest, or somewhere in between?
2. Do I have the right attitude when I encounter difficulties and trials? Or do I avoid them and despise them at all cost?
3. What can I do or change to make sufferings draw me closer to God?

## PRAYERWATCH - SOLDIERS OF CHRIST, ARISE

As we start a new year it is good to look at what happened on the Prayerwatch last year. In 2011 we had 42 new listings [47 previous year] on the Intercession Section with 62 coming off [60 previous year], meaning we started the year with 114 on and ended with 94 on the list. Of the 42 new on the list, 14 went on the Healing Section, 8 went on the Family section, 12 families were affected by the death of a loved one going on the Bereavement Section and the other 8 over the other four sections.

At the end of 2011 of the 94 on the Intercession list Auckland had 29 [30%], Central [Hawkes Bay, Wellington, Nelson] 15 [16%], Blenheim 15 [16%], Christchurch 27 [28%], Southern [Timaru and South] 8 [8%]. The 42 requests to go on the list last year came from: Auckland 16 [40%], Central 6 [15%], Blenheim 2 [5%], Christchurch 13 [30%], and Southern 5 [12%]. Looking at the number of Covenant members in the Community shows: Auckland [46%], Central [15%], Blenheim [10%], Christchurch [23%], and Southern [6%].

God is calling us to take a stand as in the prophetic word given from January till June 2011; the theme of spiritual warfare was in 17 words out of 102 received. From July to December 2011 another 22 words out of 96 were received with encouragement to spiritual warfare.

***“I looked for someone among them who would build up the wall and stand before me in the gap on behalf of the land so I would not have to destroy it, but I found no one. Ezekiel 22:30 (NIV)***

Thankfully we have at least 100 plus warriors who stand in the gap of the Prayerwatch which is the wall surrounding the Lamb of God Community. The ‘Lamb of God’ has around 180 Covenant members and there are 168 hours in a week and we are trying to cover 144 hours outside of the Lord’s Day but we still struggle. With many Underway members taking an hour we really need to ask ourselves, is God calling me to be a part of the Prayerwatch? Am I protecting the “Lamb of God” and my family by being involved or am I leaving it to somebody else to stand in the gap? Some branches are doing well while apathy is affecting others.

If we are not taking our place on the Watch, we need to ask ourselves if we are being fair to our fellow members by not standing in the gap. We are asking members to take a time that suits when their branch is doing the Watch, not to take difficult times. Let 2012 be the year we have more people doing the Watch than there are hours in the week so contact your branch Prayerwatch leaders or talk with your pastoral group leader and take your place patrolling the wall surrounding the Lamb of God. If you have any comments or questions concerning the Prayerwatch then please send them to me or give them to one of your branch leaders to send to me. God bless and watch over you all.
