REFLECTIONS... 'Building Memories and Strengthening Into the Future...'

Veronica emphasises the value in 'building memories' with regard to our children, and now our grandchildren. She is passionate in believing in the value of doing this and in this has always encouraged me in setting aside time to 'take the kids out' into the outdoors or on some form of adventure they will remember. In the photographic slide show created by our son-in-law Kieran and shown at our recent wedding anniversary there was ample evidence of our doing just that. Photographs of our three young children up in the National Parks with snow clad peaks in the distance, of standing under waterfalls, tracking up hills, and touching the moraine ice face of a mighty glacier [get that close to the ice face today and you risk getting locked up] and the like. This led our children to do a number of things such as Danny with his fishing, Glen running a marathon and Sue getting to a base camp under Everest and later gaining deep sea diving accreditation. Today at forty-nine she still sets aside time to run half marathons. And all of our children would talk avidly about these family adventures.



And now we are into the grandchildren era and this has proven good for me as it hopefully is proving for our four. Outdoor 'adventures' with the grandchildren started when the older two were eight years or nine years old. We 'climbed' Mt Dunblane; why?- because it was the biggest peak around at 1,303 metres and it had some great features that readily translated in my stories about such things as 'The Plateau of Moon Craters' and 'The Ridge of the Great Giant Spiders.' Veronica patiently awaited our return for many hours. Ten years later they still remember and recount every bit of detail. This beginning has led to these same two to come experience some climbing with me in the Southern Alps. They loved it and it is funny recalling our first foray when granddad



carried almost everything imaginable in food, drink, emergency blankets, all their gear and so much extra warm clothing. Clarice and Nat forged ahead towards the snow with just the 'exciting gear', my ice-axe, helmet and ice-crampons! I was exhausted after the first hour.

Last week I needed to test out my endurance ability following an injury which stopped me attending recent meetings in the United States. The injury has lingered resulting in quite a bit of muscle cramping. And so I headed back into the mountains and this time I took my thirteen year old grandson who has patiently waited his turn 'up there with granddad'. We enjoyed a very long day in getting high, crossing avalanche flows and getting turned back as a snow storm approached late afternoon. I gave Sebastian the responsibility to pick our way down and in several hours he only needed ask my opinion on direction twice. We finished a day of building memories by being the last customers to get into the mountain café before it closed for the evening and we reminisced whilst drinking hot chocolate and doing justice to a steak and cheese pie!

In this issue you will read of another 'memory building' initiative in the Christchurch Branch when Chris and Robert took a team of young boys on a six hour trail into the hills. Such adventures build respect and lasting friendships and are as important as any children's ministry programme we might have at our gatherings. We need to capture the moment and build into the future. One of my daily prayers is that the Lord will grant me sufficient health to continue our memory building adventures for many more years.

MINISTRY IN FIJI WITH CHILDREN AND YOUTH

From October 8 to Sunday 14th a combined team from Lamb of God New Zealand and Patmos Community of Suva, combined together to serve in the Lamb of God Nadi to assist the local community in establishing a Children's Ministry and to explore building an Encounter Jesus Youth Ministry based in Nadi but to eventually serve as a focal point for the youth from Lautoka, Ba, Tavua and RakiRaki. The Children's Ministry initiative went so well. Anticipated attendance was 10 to 12 children and this was based on



regular attendances when the ministry for community children is held in LegaLega where Pastor Timoci and his extended family live. But three times this number turned up. A main reason for this was the Children's Event was held at the HART Compound which is located in the flood prone area where the Nadi Community meets and this made it easier for many more local children to participate. This raises an obvious opportunity. Why not hold the ministry at the HART every week and thus give the community a wider base of opportunity to grow? We would

certainly consider such an option/opportunity in New Zealand. However here in Nadi and Navaki not one member owns a motor vehicle. In fact not one member in Nadi, Lautoka, Ba, Tavua or RakiRaki owns a car! Different world and that brings different challenges to the Sword of the Spirit as we seek to establish Lamb of God Nadi as a community. The Youth Event was also a very good and well run event but in this case the anticipated number was 25-30, and the attendance of youth was less than 10. But we will get there! Our thanks to the generous members of the Lamb of God who gifted just under NZ\$700.00 in cash to be gifted to needs in Fiji, plus an amazing near 80 kilograms of books, crayons and other materials as gifts and materials for children's ministry in Nadi.

LAMB OF GOD CENTRE- EARTHQUAKE DAMAGE UPDATE

We can now give an update to members regarding earthquake damage at the Lamb of God Centre as follows:

- The Main Hall, damaged in September 2010, and severally so again in February 2011, is now deemed dangerous and is to be demolished in the near future. This Hall has been closed for near two years now and carries 'Danger Keep Out' signs. It was also recently surrounded by security fencing.
- The contract for demolition is arranged and once we have date we will arrange a supervised and limited number 'working bee' to move items from the hall, side entrance, and the main kitchen into the auditorium area for longer term keeping.
- We are also advised the rest of the Centre may be repairable and upgradable to meet the acceptable compliance code for public access buildings. In order to obtain the required professional assessments, costing and timeline, which will include assessing a hall rebuild, we have engaged OPUS International to assess and cost these matters and they have advised they will start this work immediately.

In the meantime there is an absolute ban around and in the hall. You are warned it is dangerous. And there is also no access allowed inside the rest of the building without approval from Roger [383 2631] or Robert Van Doorn [383 4633] Mark Challies [383 3298] or John Murray [383 2888]. Any approval also requires a 'spotter' to be present at an open door, and the spotter must have a live mobile phone. Keep praying for God's justice for our damaged homes and the Lamb of God Centre.

“How to Backslide Effectively”

November 2012

Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. [1 Peter 5:8-9]

Many years ago, I read a book by C.S. Lewis entitled *The Screwtape Letters*, a satirical novel about the plans, ideas and strategies of a ‘senior’ devil [Screwtape] to his neophyte nephew [Wormwood]. Their goal is to bring their ‘client’ into eternal damnation. In living [and failing many times!] in Christian community over the years, I can perhaps give my small list of ‘advices’ if we will allow our enemy to win over us. [Note: This is reverse-psychology stuff – take it properly!]

So How Do We “Backslide Effectively?”

1. Start compromising with your prayer life. Start with excuses of busy-ness, urgent matters, etc. Then slowly fade away from daily prayer most of the times to sometimes, to seldom, and then to none. You need to slowly compromise on the quantity and the quality of your time of prayer. Most of all – do not touch the Bible!
2. Look at what the community – your brothers and sisters - can do for you, not what you can do for them. Why should you care for them when you have your own needs?
3. Always focus on the programmes and activities and agendas, and not on relationships. The easier you focus on things rather than relationships, the better.
4. Harbour ill-feelings and resentments with others. Keep them to yourself; do not deal with them and keep them ‘fresh’ every day. Keep on adding names and occasions of your own hurts and disappointments with brothers and sisters. Do not judge them quickly and make the worst conclusions readily. Why forgive?
5. Allow compromises with small things – after all, everyone does them, don’t they? Start compromising with things like family life, priorities, wasting time, lying, negative speech, small sin here and there, etc. In due time, you will lose your sensitivity and you will start compromising on big things.
6. When things are too difficult, just give up. What’s the point? You are the boss – everything should be to your liking, and when it becomes too difficult, run away!

If you keep on doing the things above, they will become habits in due time. Habits form our destiny. And what a dreadful destiny will it be!
